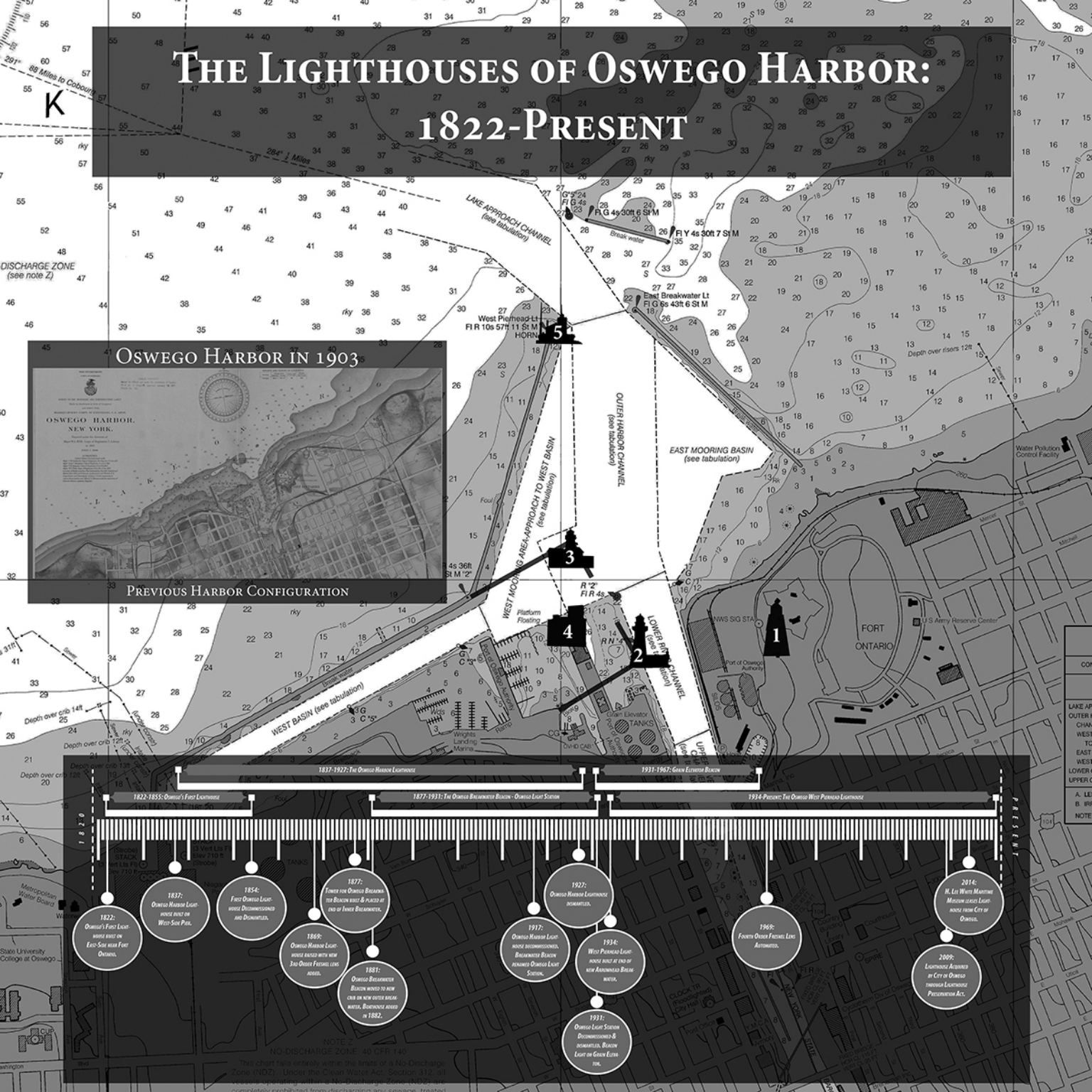


# THE LIGHTHOUSES OF OSWEGO HARBOR: 1822-PRESENT



1822-1855: Oswego's First Lighthouse

1877-1931: The Oswego Breakwater Buoy - Oswego Light Station

1934-Present: The Oswego West Pierhead Lighthouse

- 1822: Oswego's First Lighthouse built on Egg-Skin near Fort Ontario.
- 1837: Oswego Harbor Light house built on West-Side Pier.
- 1854: First Oswego Light house demolished and donated.
- 1869: Oswego Harbor Light house replaced with new 3rd Oswego Federal Lens house.
- 1877: Tower for Oswego Breakwater Buoy built & placed at end of Outer Breakwater.
- 1889: Oswego Harbor Light house replaced with new 3rd Oswego Federal Lens house.
- 1891: Oswego Breakwater Buoy moved to new site on new outer breakwater. Buoyhouse added in 1892.
- 1917: Oswego Harbor Light house demolished. Breakwater Buoy replaced Oswego Light Station.
- 1927: Oswego Harbor Lighthouse demolished.
- 1931: Oswego Light Station demolished & replaced. Buoy Light on Green Earth.
- 1934: West Pierhead Light house built at end of new Breakwater Buoy pier.
- 1969: Fourth Oswego Federal Lens Automated.
- 2009: Lighthouse Automated in City of Oswego through Lighthouse Preservation Act.
- 2014: H. Eli Wren Mooring Masthead Light built in City of Oswego.
